Enjoy the Quaint and Beautiful Towns Along the Delaware Bayshore Byway

The Delaware Bayshore Byway is replete with beautiful and unique small towns, showcasing the expansive history and culture of a people deeply connected to life on the water.

Make a day of it with this preset itinerary on the Delaware Bayshore Byway and explore quaint villages and towns. Discover hidden gems and enjoy a slower pace of life.

Located on the Delaware River just six miles south of Wilmington, the city serves as the northern gateway to the Delaware Bayshore Byway. A stroll through the historic district will transport you back to the 1700s when the seeds of a new country were taking root. Some places to explore include:

- Jessop's Tavern:
 - Enjoy a meal at the oldest tavern in Historic Newcastle.
- **Dutch House Museum and Gardens:**Explore the beautiful gardens and the museum.
- New Castle Battery Park:
 Enjoy the playgrounds, walking trail and green space.
- New Castle County Courthouse Museum: Take in history and explore New Castle's roots.





Delaware City 30 Clinton St. Delaware City, DE 19706





Delaware City is a quaint riverfront community proud of its rich history. Located on the Delaware River in New Castle County, you'll find Delaware City is home to many natural and historic treasures.

• Fort Delaware State Park:

Take a boat ride over to Pea Island and tour historic Fort Delaware.

American Birding Association:

Visit the headquarters of one of the most prominent birding organizations in America.

· Crabby Dicks:

Grab a beverage or meal on their deck for a great view of the Delaware River.

• Delaware City Battery Park:

Explore the small waterfront park, see the historic lock, and watch the big ships in the bay.

Leipsic 283 Front St. Leipsic, DE 19901

You'll feel Leipsic's relaxed vibe as you walk along the water, which has helped the town become a popular spot for fishermen and crabbers, and a quintessential spot for quiet living along the water.

· The Wheel of Fortune House:

Drive by this historic home, probably named as a play on words for the owner – John Chance.

· Sambo's Tavern:

Down-to-earth restaurant known for their crabs. It is closed from late October – early April.

Little Creek 458 Main St. Little Creek, DE 19961





The Town of Little Creek, settled in the early 1800's, allegedly was first inhabited by pirates. Originally called Little Landing, the town was most prosperous in the late 1800's when a thriving oyster industry emerged.

• Little Creek Dog Park and Playground:

Take a break to let your four-footed or two footed friends play in this beautiful playground with an adjacent dog park.

• Old Stone Tavern:

Drive by this historic home (not a tavern!) from the 1800's – located next to the playground.

Stroll through downtown Milford and you'll come upon three contiguous National Register Historic Districts: North Milford, Victorian, and Shipyard Historic Districts.

· Stroll the Riverwalk:

Meander along the Mispillion River while enjoying the painted boats, historic buildings and engaging shops.

• Explore Walnut Street:

The main shopping street in Milford, Walnut has a plethora of boutiques, galleries, and charming restaurants and also the Milford Museum.





Milton 210 Union St. Milton, DE 19968





In the historic Town Center, you'll have fun exploring dozens of small businesses, including famous King's Ice Cream on Union Street – don't miss the **Milton Theatre**.

• Tour the Dogfish Head Brewery:

Perhaps you have worked up a thirst? Enjoy a free brewery tour of an iconic Delaware beer experience.

• Play in the Milton Memorial Park:

This lovely park has extensive playgrounds, a train and kayak access to the still waters. Enjoy the picnic tables.

Visit the Milton Historical Society:

See many exhibits and objects recounting the history of Milton.
